INPUT FOR EVER?

You are all welcome to INPUT 91, here at the invitation of Irish Television for the first time in this international event's history.

For those of you who have previously attended INPUT, you will find between the covers of this volume, all the ingredients for the successful event you know INPUT to be: strong and often provocative programmes, good professional discussions, and many opportunities to meet partners for future co-productions, sales and acquisitions.

Being in Dublin, this year's European City of Culture, our conference will have a special flavour. For many North-Americans, coming to Dublin is very special considering the bonds between the two countries. Ireland is also very special to the heart of Europeans. May the flavour of Irish conviviality influence our meetings in Trinity College!

For newcomers, let me remind you that INPUT is organised on a non-profit basis. None of the people who sit on its board are paid. All our expenses are covered by public television services around the world. The reason for their participation is clear: the values of public television are every year more threatened by commercial aggressiveness.

In many countries, public television networks are now poorer and weaker than their private counterparts. This makes such international co-operation a strong necessity! But the border is not necessary between the public and the private. Some privately run organisations can provide models for public ones, and their participation in INPUT is thus essential.

So what then is the real aim of public broadcasting for public service television? For us, at INPUT, the answer is simple: ORIGINAL CREATION. The programmes that you will discover here in Dublin were selected by a group of 18 independent producers and directors, our Shop Stewards.

They met this spring in Florence - hosted in fine fashion by RAI, Italy's public network. (We thank the Prix Italia group, Secretary General Piergiorgio Branzi and his Deputy Giancarlo Barberis). The programmes they selected, each one a unique creation, are very different in format, budget, production techniques etc. from one another. Yet they all share a simple trust in film and video as a true meaning of expression and communication, making television more than just a mirror.
